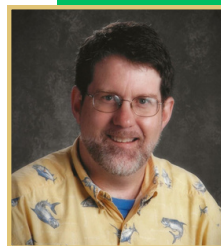

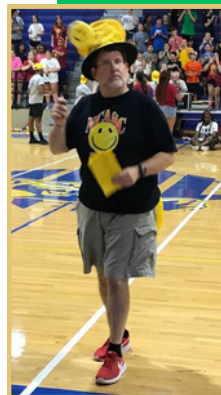
VSCA Advisor Workshop
